COURT NEWS

LISBON — A Trumbull County man pleaded guilty in county Common Pleas Court to using the identity of someone else to purchase a pickup truck from a Columbiana dealership.

Lawrence K. McBride, 32, of Hubbard, pleaded guilty to identity fraud, which was reduced from a third degree felony to a fourth degree felony as part of a plea agreement reached with the county prosecutor's office. He is scheduled to be sentenced on June 30.

McBride passed himself off as Kevin McBride when purchasing a 2002 Chevy S-10 from Columbiana Buick-Olds last July. The truck cost nearly \$14,000.

In other court action: A charge of possessing a weapon despite a prior felony conviction against John JC Marcum was thrown out by Judge C. Ashley Pike.

Marcum, 30, formerly of Echo Dell Trailer Court, is currently in prison on other felony charges. He is scheduled to go on trial May 27 for committing perjury, receiving stolen property, theft, misuse of a credit card, and having weapons despite a prior felony conviction.

The latter charge, involving a shotgun found in his possession, arose out of his arrest on a felonious assault charge that was the subject of his current imprisonment. Pike ruled there was an inordinate delay between when the offense occurred and indictment.

A trial date of June 10 was scheduled in the case of John R. Sullivan Jr., 31, who is charged with escape.
